



# TACTICAL COMBAT, MEDICAL & RESCUE DOCTRINES

01	<b>CSAT</b>	Combat shooting and tactics involves basic battlefield insertion, operation, and exit maneuvers with three fundamental field weapons of the combatant – assault rifle / carbine, handgun / pistol, and bayonet / knife	
02		Search and rescue involves ops/victim management, advanced rope and rappelling, structural collapse, confined space, trench and excavation, vehicle and machinery, water, wilderness, and K9 modes	<b>SAR</b>
03	<b>AOT</b>	Advanced operations and tactics involves advanced weaponry, armor, explosive handling, sniper ops, K9, rope skills, armored vehicles, advanced breach, HALO/HALO, hostage negotiations, micro-surgical battles	
04		Survival involves sustaining life in difficult environments, evasion is avoiding capture, resistance is ability to maintain confidentiality under extreme interrogations, and escape is to getaway from captivity	<b>SERE</b>
05	<b>CQC</b>	Close quarter combat is when an assailant engages a combatant at short-range. It requires disengagement prior to counter attack. Focus is on weapon priority, retention, transition, and threat neutralization	
06		Combat casualty care focuses on how a non-medical combatant can save the life of his/her colleague from common battlefield injuries, when under fire, prior to specialized medical response units, medevac and definitive care medical phases	<b>CCC</b>
